Drawing on case study examples that highlight pollution prevention, choosing locations at major plants (CLAMP), negotiations, and surrendering control of an activity, Greenberg presents a hybrid framework that advocates the

amalgamation of industrial location processes with human health and environmental-oriented risk analysis.
